**PHYSICAL EDUCATION TEACHER CERTIFICATION (PEK)**

**I. REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION TO THE PROFESSIONAL PHASE OF THE PROGRAM**

The following requirements indicate “preparedness” to begin working towards teacher certification

1. Complete a minimum of 15 hours at Texas A&M
2. Minimum GPR requirement of 2.75 or higher at Texas A&M
3. Complete the following **bold** courses with a grade of “C” or better:  

<b>KINE 121#</b>	<b>KINE 210</b>	<b>BIOL 107 or 111</b>	<b>PHYS 201</b>

  - May be enrolled in these courses during the semester in which you apply
  - Preferred - Complete ENGL 104 and ENGL/COMM with a minimum “B/C” grade combination
  - # - Courses that must be taken at Texas A&M University
4. Complete Swim Proficiency Requirement
  - All PEK majors must demonstrate swimming proficiency prior to acceptance. This can be accomplished in one of three ways:
    - Grade of “C” or better in the KINE 199 Majors Aquatics class (Counts on degree)
    - Grade of “C” or better in the KINE 199 Intermediate Swim class (Does not count on degree)
    - Successful completion (80% or higher) on the Swimming Proficiency Test
5. Complete application through CEHD Portal
  - Link to CEHD Portal: <https://myrecord.cehd.tamu.edu/hlknapps/teedadmission/>
  - Application includes:
    - Professional Phase Admission Acknowledgement
    - General Information (Name & Swim Proficiency Documentation)
    - Intent to Student Teach
    - Expectations for Professional Behavior
    - Grade Review – Input all grades received up to this point
  - Submit application the semester you are finishing your bolded courses
  - Advisor will email the deadline dates each semester

**Application Decision**

Notifications regarding your application decision will be sent out approximately three weeks after the deadline via email. This notification will include instructions for what you will need to do next, based the decision of your application.

**Professional Phase vs. Admission to Educator Preparation Program**

Requirements to get into professional phase and to begin the PEK Education Preparation program are aligned. The first day of class following the semester you are admitted to professional phase begins your official start into teacher preparation. All shaded coursework and any field based coursework, except for KNFB 222, must be completed after this time to allow you to meet the minimum 300+ field based hours that are required by Texas Education Agency (TEA) to be certified in the State of Texas. Subsequently, if you take any shaded coursework before your official acceptance into professional phase through the CEHD portal your ability to be certified through the PEK program will not be possible unless other arrangements are made with PEK faculty to make up those field-based hours.

### III. KINE 199 REQUIREMENT FOR PEK

Here are the rules that apply to your KINE 199 requirements

1. You must take KINE 199 Majors Resist/Flex
2. You must take 5 additional courses from the specified categories in the chart below
3. You must take these courses for a grade. They cannot be taken Pass/Fail
4. You must take these courses at Texas A&M. These courses cannot be transferred in
5. You cannot take the same course twice to count for multiple categories
6. From time to time additional KINE 199 Majors courses will be offered that might fulfill degree requirements. Prior to enrolling in a KINE 199 Majors course outside of what is listed, contact your advisor for approval and to confirm what category it might fulfill
7. Non-Majors or 'Regular' KINE 199 courses will not count towards your degree requirements. You can take regular KINE 199 courses for additional development in sports after you have completed all of the ones required for your degree

### IV. PROGRESS TOWARDS DEGREE

Student Rule 1.5.1 states, “A student is expected to register for a schedule of courses that follows the program of study for a degree in his or her college. A student who elects not to follow the program of study must obtain approval from his or her academic advisor. A student who fails to obtain approval may be held from registration, removed from the inappropriate course(s) and/or required to register for a prescribed schedule of courses” Periodically advisors will check to make sure you are taking classes towards your degree. If you are planning on changing majors or taking prerequisites for professional school, please let your advisor know.

### V. UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE PLANNER REQUIREMENT

All students are required by TEC§51.9685 (formerly House Bill 3025) to complete an online undergraduate degree plan once every year until graduation. The Undergraduate Degree Planner and a guide are in Howdy on the My Record tab under the Undergraduate Degree Planner channel. This is not a substitute for advising and approval of your Undergraduate Degree Planner does NOT ensure you are meeting all of the requirements for graduation. The Degree Planner typically opens for submission on March 1<sup>st</sup> and is due for the Health & Kinesiology by August 1<sup>st</sup>. The Degree Planner is accessible at any time to plan future semesters.

### VI. REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION TO STUDENT TEACHING

All coursework must be completed before you can student teach. No exceptions will be made.

1. Submit departmental *Intent to Graduate* form (<http://mycehd.tamu.edu/students/undergraduate-forms/#hlkn>) by the deadline (announced each semester): **one year before graduation/student teaching semester.**
2. Minimum 2.5 overall GPA
3. Complete all coursework with the required grades as listed in your degree plan packet
4. Submit evidence of First Aid and CPR proficiency. Must be valid through student teaching semester
5. Successful completion of Final Portfolio Review/Defense in KNFB 416. Your portfolio review must be scheduled with the program coordinator, Dr. Jiling Liu, no later than the Q-Drop date
6. Student Teaching Placement is coordinated during KNFB 416. HLKN will place students in Austin, Dallas, Houston, San Antonio, Central and East Texas. Local Placements will only be considered for extenuating circumstances. A Lease/Rent contract is NOT considered an extenuating circumstance.

## **VII. REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION**

1. Successfully complete all degree plan courses with the minimum required grade in each
2. Minimum GPR requirement: 2.5 overall at Texas A&M.
3. Apply for graduation and pay the diploma fee the semester you are graduating.
4. Transfer all applicable courses to Texas A&M by the registrars deadline.

## **VIII. DIFFERENTIAL TUITION**

Differential tuition is an additional semester charge that pays for educational enhancements to the undergraduate students in teacher preparation degree plans within the college. Students will incur a differential tuition charge of \$300 every semester after they are admitted to professional phase. Differential tuition helps support field based placements, supervision, scholarships and international/urban experiences in culturally diverse settings. Students should expect to pay this fee a minimum of four semesters.

## **IX. PRELIMINARY CRIMINAL HISTORY EVALUATION FOR EDUCATOR CERTIFICATION CANDIDATES**

Texas Education Agency offers a Preliminary Criminal History Evaluation Educator Certification Candidates for a non-refundable fee of \$50.00. This optional service will allow those individuals who are contemplating obtaining a Texas Teacher Certificate in the future, the opportunity to have a review of an existing criminal history performed by agency staff. The review will be based solely on information provided by the candidate and will result in a non-binding opinion issued by the agency as to whether or not the candidate would be eligible for Texas Teacher Certification at the time of the evaluation. This process does not preclude a candidate from being required to submit to a national criminal history review as required by statute at the time of application for educator credentials. # PORTFOLIO REQUIREMENTS

## PHYSICAL EDUCATION TEACHER CERTIFICATION (PEK)

### CATALOG 142

- **Each student will complete a total of 45 hours of independent field based experiences**
- These experiences may NOT come from required field-based coursework hours or experiences
- These experiences must be completed once the student has been admitted to professional phase. If you take a professional phase course before you are admitted in the portal, you will be required to take additional hours to meet state requirements
- Students must submit evidence of valid CPR and First Aid Certifications that will remain active throughout student teaching
- Students must maintain a separate log of all their independent experiences that lists the date, number of hours, area of experience (school, coaching, or community), level (secondary or elementary), location, contact person (name, phone, & email), and the signature of the person. Examples of this log can be found under forms on the MyCEHD website

All independent field based experiences must include a MINIMUM of 15 hours from each of the three (3) areas below and each area must have a minimum of 5 hours at the elementary level and at least 5 hours at the secondary level.

#### COACHING:

15 hours minimum: at least 5 hours in elementary\* and 5 hours in secondary\*\*

- School-based classroom (PE) observation
- Community-based programs (Kids Klub, Boys and Girls club)
- Coaching (school or community based)

#### COMMUNITY-BASED PROGRAMS (Not Coaching)

15 hours minimum: at least 5 hours in elementary\* and 5 hours in secondary\*\*

- Boys and Girls Club
- Camp Counselor
- Scouts
- Big Brother/Sister
- Juvenile Courts
- Community Education Literacy or Math programs (HOSTS)
- Community Centers
- Other Community-based programs with approval of KNFB 222 instructor

#### SCHOOL- BASED PROGRAMS (Not Coaching)

15 hours minimum: at least 5 hours in elementary\* and 5 hours in secondary\*\*

- These hours must come from observing/volunteering in a classroom either in a public or private school

\*Elementary = Pre-K – 6

\*\*Secondary = 7<sup>th</sup> -12<sup>th</sup>

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#### PORTFOLIO and ADMISSION to PROFESSIONAL PHASE:

- Requirements to get into professional phase and to begin your portfolio are aligned. The first day of class following the semester you are admitted to professional phase begins your official start into teacher preparation. All shaded coursework and any field based coursework, except for KNFB 222, must be completed after admission to allow you to meet the minimum TEA requirements. If you take any shaded coursework before your official acceptance into professional phase you will be required to complete more than 45 hours to complete your portfolio
- Student will be given directions in KNFB 222 about how to build their portfolio and what is required

#### FINAL PORTFOLIO REVIEW/DEFENSE:

- **Total Hours:** Must be completed in its entirety (45 hours).
- **Portfolio includes:**
  - Introduction, professional photo, email address, and philosophy of Education
  - Experiences: descriptions of the three experiences student had with coaching, community and school programs
  - Standards: Artifacts supporting each program standard
  - Self-assessment (What have you learned in the process, and what you still need to learn)
  - Resume (To be used in job application)
- **DEADLINE:** Must set up the review/defense date prior to Q-drop of the semester enrolled in KNFB 416.
- **Student teaching placement** dependent upon completion of the final portfolio review/defense.
